2. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

In February, Barcelona experiences mild temperatures, marking the end of winter. The average maximum temperature hovers around 15°C (59°F), while the minimum temperature averages around 7°C (45°F). A few items to include when packing for your trip:



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- Warm and comfortable clothing: Consider packing layers such as jumpers and a light coat to stay cosy during cooler mornings and evenings. Business casual attire may be preferred for School for Thinktankers sessions and networking events. Long-sleeved tops, trousers, skirts, dresses, and comfortable shoes are suitable for casual outings.
- Travel adaptors: Barcelona primarily uses plug types C and F. Type C plugs are the standard European two-pin plugs, type F plugs are grounded and include an additional pin. It's advisable to check your devices' compatibility and acquire the necessary adaptors before travelling.
- Your own computer/tablet/notebook.
- Business cards.
- If you like, you can bring a small item from your country as a gift to everyone (e.g. sweets, key chains, fridge magnets, etc.). You can also bring flyers about your work, or a poster displaying your work, including a section on opportunities to connect and collaborate.

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3. INFORMATION CENTRES AND CONNECTIVITY

3.1. BARCELONA TOURIST INFORMATION

We recommend accessing the official **Barcelona Tourisme website** for comprehensive information about the city's attractions, events, and activities.

Additionally, you can visit the **Barcelona Tourist Information Points** located at key points throughout the city, including the airport terminals and Plaça de Catalunya. These centres offer personalised assistance, maps, and brochures to help you make the most of your time in Barcelona.

The **Tourist Information Points** have a Call centre that operates from 8AM to 8PM (Barcelona time).

3.2. TELEPHONE AND WI-FI

For your convenience, you can purchase a **prepaid Spanish SIM card** upon arrival in Barcelona, provided your phone is compatible. These SIM cards are available from various providers and can be found at the airport, as well as in stores throughout the city.

Free WIFI is available at Barcelona's airport, allowing you to download maps and access essential information upon arrival. Instructions for accessing the WIFI can typically be found at designated areas within the airport.

Moreover, WIFI is widely available throughout Barcelona, including our School for Thinktankers venues and study locations. For more information on public WIFI hotspots in the city, refer to the official [Barcelona Tourisme website](#) or inquire at your accommodations during your stay.

You can also hire a personal **Travel WIFI**, a small device that acts as a modem and allows you to have connectivity wherever you go. You can rent it with a standard fee, however, please note that you will be asked to leave a deposit for it.

4.2. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

This section provides detailed insights into various travel options, including ticketing alternatives and operational details for both the metro and bus systems.

In Barcelona, **TMB** stands for Transports Metropolitans de Barcelona. It is the public transport company responsible for managing the city's metro, bus, and tram networks, providing essential transportation services to residents and visitors alike.

The TMB operates as an integrated fare system, enabling seamless transfers across various modes of transport within a designated time frame. Upon validating your

ticket, you can freely transfer between metro, buses, tram, and suburban rail for up to one hour and fifteen minutes. You can either use it by acquiring multiple **single tickets** or obtain **cards for multiple trips**.


Here's how each option works:

- **Single ticket:** Allows one-time use, priced at 2.40€ (excludes airport metro access but includes the airport bus).
- **Unlimited trips:** The “Hola Barcelona” (Hey Barcelona) card includes unlimited trips for a selected period. Prices range from 16.40€ (48h), 23.80€ (72h), 31€ (96h), or 38.20€ (120h).
- **Multiple trips (10):** The “T-Casual” card costs 11.35€ and includes 10 trips.

How to get your tickets or card?

To acquire a **ticket** for using TMB, you have several options:

- **Ticket machines:** Ticket machines are available at metro stations, tram stops, and some bus stops. You can purchase single tickets, multiple journey tickets, or travel cards directly from these machines using cash or card.
- **TMB app:** You can also purchase tickets through the TMB app (listed above). The app allows you to buy and store tickets digitally on your smartphone.
- **TMB website:** Alternatively, you can buy tickets online through the TMB website (listed above). After purchasing, you can either print your tickets or display them digitally on your mobile device.
- **TMB information points:** TMB information points located at major metro stations also offer ticket sales services. You can approach the staff at these points for assistance in purchasing tickets.

 Ensure to **validate your ticket** upon boarding the metro, bus, or tram to ensure it is valid for travel.


To purchase the **Hola Barcelona and T-Casual cards**, you can follow these steps:

Hola Barcelona Card:

- **Online:** Visit the official Barcelona Turisme website or download the Hola Barcelona app (listed above), select your preferred language and follow its instructions. You can choose the type of card (for 2, 3, 4, or 5 consecutive days).
- **In person:** You can also purchase the Hola Barcelona card in person at Barcelona Turisme information points located at major transportation hubs such as the airport, Sants train station, and Plaça de Catalunya. Simply approach the staff at these points for assistance in purchasing the card.

T-Casual Card:

- **Online:** Visit the official TMB website or download the TMB app (listed above). Follow the instructions to purchase the T-Casual card online. You can choose the number of journeys you'd like to load onto the card.
- **Ticket machines:** T-Casual cards can also be purchased from ticket machines at metro stations, tram stops, and some bus stops. Simply select the option to purchase a T-Casual card from the ticket machine menu and follow the on-screen instructions to complete your purchase.

 Once you have purchased your card, ensure to **validate** it before boarding any metro, bus, or tram in Barcelona.

Metro

The city of Barcelona has a **metro system** that features **12 lines**, operating in the following schedules:

- Monday to Thursday from 5:00 to 24:00
- Fridays and holiday eves from 5:00 to 2:00 (extended service)
- Saturdays and Sundays it offers a 24-hour service

Bus system

Barcelona's bus network boasts over 100 routes, connecting all city districts and the metropolitan area, while additional routes link Barcelona with neighboring towns for regional travel.

The bus system has a varied schedule. Generally, buses start their routes between 4:25 and 5:00, with service ending around 23:00. There are also night buses (called "Nitbus") that operate approximately from 22:40 to 6:00, covering a large portion of the city.

How to know the direction of my bus?

Displayed on the buses you will find a letter and a bus number to codify routes. Letter V is for vertical routes, D for diagonal, and H for horizontal.

Important note:

Barcelona has a tourist bus. This is not a part of Barcelona's public transportation system but it is operated by a private tourism company. Two companies provide this service: "Barcelona City Tour" and "Barcelona Bus Turístic". Both companies have the same price, and to take them you would need to book a place directly with the company. This is not covered in the "Hola Barcelona" card or "T-Casual" card.

4.3. ARRIVING AT THE AIRPORT

Welcome to Barcelona! Navigating from the airport to the heart of the city is simple and convenient, with several transportation options available. Below, we outline the most efficient ways to reach your destination, ensuring a smooth start to your Barcelona experience.

Getting from the airport to the city centre offers multiple transportation choices:

Metro

Take metro line L9 directly from the airport to the city, connecting with lines L5, L3, and L1 for further access to your hotel area. Ensure you have a metro card for access.



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Taxi

Outside the airport, official yellow and black taxis are waiting to take you to your destination. Their metres start at the beginning of the ride. Fares from the airport range between 30–35€, offering convenient door-to-door service.



AEROBUS

A private company, offers single tickets for 6.75€ and round-trip tickets for 11.65€.



Bus number 46

A local service, transports you from the airport to Plaza España. You can pay onboard or purchase a transportation card at the nearest metro station.

- L1 (Arc de Triomf) – 10 min walk from the station
- L4 & L1 (Urquinaona) – 5 min walk from the station

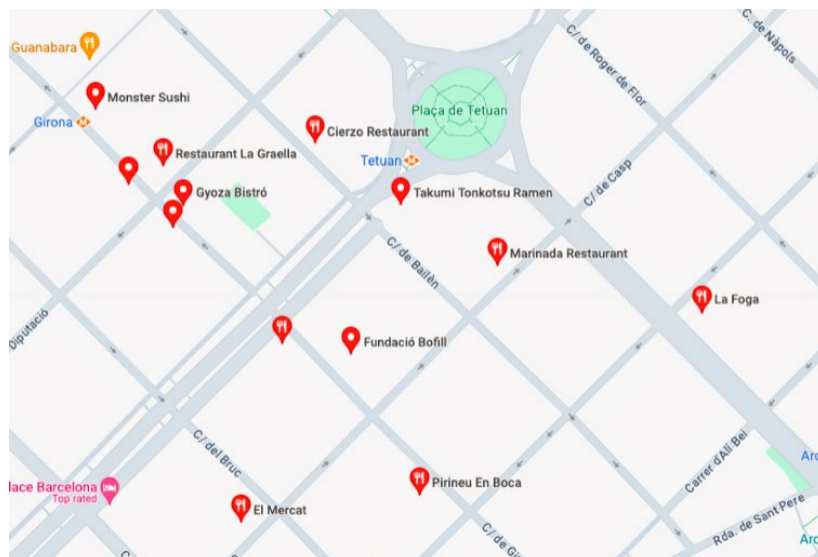

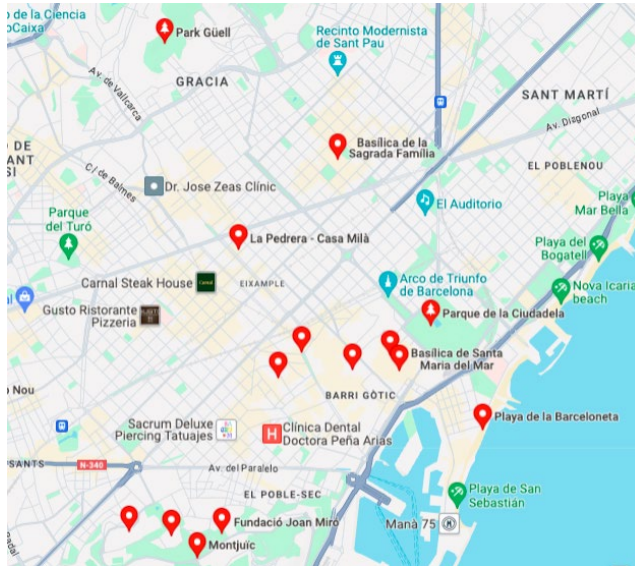
